1. The Italian Sojourn: Handel in Rome G.F. Handel Dixit Dominus HWV 232 Including instrumental music by Corelli and others

The twenty-one year old Handel left Hamburg in the spring of 1706 and embarked on a Grand Tour of Italy taking him to Florence, Venice, then Rome. There he spent two years writing his first oratorios, secular cantatas and settings of Latin texts filled with a fervor and passion bearing witness to the influence of Scarlatti and Corelli whom he had just met. At least for now, the young 'Sassone' would invest his artistry and creativity into this Latin environment, seemingly putting aside his Lutheran roots.

2. J.S. Bach: The Six Motets BWV 225-230

Saturday 20 February 7pm (St James by-the-Sea Episcopal Church) Sunday 21 February 7pm (Loyola Marymount University - Murphy Recital Hall)

J.S. Bach's Six Motets have served as a point of reference for the Bach Collegium San Diego's repertoire since the ensembles founding. This season the Chorus of the Bach Collegium San Diego will perform all Six Motets in one program, with varying vocal configurations, immediately displaying the breadth and vitality of Bach's vocal output. The motets have been admired by composers through the centuries as "pinnacles of absolute vocal music".





3. Mysteries of the Passion

François Couperin Leçons de Ténèbres - Heinrich Schütz Psalms of David Heinrich Ignaz Biber selections from the Rosary Sonatas

Through the centuries, music has sought to depict the inherent drama in the liturgy and rituals connected to Christ's Passion. Soloists of the Bach Collegium San Diego offer a program evoking the suffering, lamenting, emptiness and darkness as conveyed by such works as François Couperin's *Leçons de Ténèbres* and Biber's *Rosary Sonatas*.

4. Claudio Monteverdi: Vespro della Beata Vergine 1610

Monday 24 May 7pm (St. John's Episcopal Cathedral, 514 W Adams Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90007)

The season concludes with the celebrated *Vespers of the Blessed Virgin Mary* celebrating the 400th anniversary since its publishing in Venice in 1610. This landmark work displays Monteverdi's ability to codify varied and diverse styles on a monumental scale. The genesis of this work is not entirely known, but may have served as Monteverdi's audition piece for the post of *maestro di cappella* at St. Mark's Basilica, Venice.
