Something Different for the Holidays: Bach Collegium San Diego presents "Gaudete! Motets and Carols: Old and New" on December 16 & 17, 2011

SAN DIEGO- <u>Bach Collegium San Diego</u> (BCSD) presents a new and different program of vocal music for the holidays: seasonal motets and carols featuring the music of Sheppard, Byrd, Tavener, Howells, and more.

This is BCSD's first solo holiday program and will be performed entirely *a cappella* (without instrumental accompaniment). The program represents music from 16th century chant all the way up to 21st century motets, making it stand out from traditional programming but still perfect for the holidays.

Performances will be on Friday, December 16, at St. James-by-the-Sea Episcopal Church in La Jolla, and Saturday, December 17, 2011, at St. Andrew's-by-the-Sea Episcopal Church in Pacific Beach. Both performances will be preceded by an informal discussion on the music beginning promptly at 6.45pm.

Music director Ruben Valenzuela says he has designed the sequence of selections to create the expectation of Christmas, carrying through the theme of the Advent, a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. The program of mostly English composers includes two San Diego premieres: the Robert Parsons *Magnificat* and portions of John Sheppard's *Missa Cantate*.

"Our December concerts will be an opportunity to hear your favorite carols alongside lesser known but 'must hear' works," said Valenzuela. "You will not want to miss the sonic vocal explosion of Robert Parson's 'Magnificat' and John Tavener's 'Annunciation,' two works written almost 400 years apart and heard for the first time in San Diego."
