Vital Signs is the report from the Holy Cow Consulting using the information you provided through the on-line or written questionnaire. It is now available on the parish website http://www.stdavid.ang-md.org/ for your interest. The areas of emphasis contained in the report are not surprising. Congregations throughout the country tend to list these priorities.

The truth is that parishes make decisions about their clergy based on much softer data than any questionnaire can furnish. This is not unlike all the other political processes we experience on a daily basis all the way from our condo association or golf club up to national elections. This is why we have a profile committee and a search committee. This makes it more likely that the information furnished and its interpretation by others will be widely shared and less susceptible to individual influence. This makes us all safer in the long run. Your vestry has bent over backwards to avoid any hint of preference or bending to single loud voices. The goal is to secure the best leadership for St. David's for the most people for the longest time.

In the meantime we are about to start Lent. The Liturgy will have a slightly more somber tone; some of you will take on extra exercises to strengthen spiritual muscles. Many of us will be preparing for Baptism, Confirmation or the reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows at the Great Vigil of Easter and later Confirmation at the Cathedral on March 30th.

My part in this is Inquirer's Class at 9:30 each Sunday morning in the Vestry room. This is always lively and I am sure St. David's will be no exception. Anyone is welcome to attend whether you have a sacramental goal or not.

This message comes to you after 6 months have elapsed on my time with you. Debby and I have very much enjoyed our time in Baltimore and expect that when the next 6 months are over we will leave with many fond memories and relationships to treasure.



The survey results and a compilation of the meeting records are available, and the viewpoints and priorities expressed provide a solid basis for the Committee's report on St. David's today and its vision for the future. Chorister Profile: Richard Giarusso, Baritone

Richard Giarusso, baritone, is a versatile musician with practical and scholarly experience in a wide range of repertoire. After undergraduate study in music and English at Williams College, he earned a PhD in historical musicology from Harvard University. His dissertation, *Dramatic Slowness: Adagio Rhetoric in Late Nineteenth-Century Austro-German Music*, was completed under the supervision of Reinhold Brinkmann. An article on the final songs of Schubert's *Winterreise* is forthcoming from Ashgate Press.

A recent transplant to the mid-Atlantic region from his native New England, Dr. Giarusso is a member of the musicology faculty at the Peabody Conservatory, where he teaches classes in nineteenth- and twentieth-century music. In addition to his scholarly work, he maintains an active career as a singer throughout the northeast. He has studied voice with Keith Kibler, William Sharp, and Pamela Dellal and has performed in master classes with Lorraine Hunt Lieberson, Mitsuko Shirai, and Hartmut Höll. Currently, he works with noted baritone John Shirley-Quirk.

An experienced ensemble singer, he was a regular member and frequent soloist with the Choir of the Church of the Advent in Boston. In addition, he has appeared with *Emmanuel Music* (Boston) and currently sings with the *Aoede Consort* (Albany, NY), the *Washington Bach Consort*, and *Chantry*. A specialist in the German lied, Dr. Giarusso is involved in a project with fortepianist Aaron Berkowitz to perform and record the Schubert song cycles with historical instruments. During the summer months, he serves as a member of the voice faculty at the Berkshire Choral Festival. Also trained as a conductor, he is the codirector and founder of Williamstown Early Music and The New Opera, both based in western Massachusetts. With these organizations, he has organized and conducted performances of Bach's St. John Passion, Schütz's Musikalische Exequien, Puccini's La Bohème, and all three Mozart/Da Ponte operas. In August, he will lead performances of Mozart's Così fan tutte with the newly-formed Hubbard Hall Opera Theatre in Cambridge, New York.


