Kathy Saltzman Romey is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Minnesota, and Artistic Director of The Minnesota Chorale, which has performed with the Minnesota Orchestra in performances conducted by Roberto Abbado, Christopher Hogwood, Nicholas McGegan, Roger Norrington, Robert Shaw, Leonard Slatkin, Osmo Vänskä, and Edo de Waart.

Kathy Romey studied in Germany at the Frankfurt Musikhochschule under acclaimed conductor Helmuth Rilling,

receiving an artistic degree in choral conducting. She has been a staff member of the Oregon Bach Festival since 1984, and is principal chorus master of the 54-voice professional choir. Additionally, she has been a chorus master to the *Internationale Bachakademie Stuttgart*.

Kathy Romey was named 2002 Conductor of the Year by the Minnesota Chapter, American Choral Directors Association.



David Cherwien was installed as Mount Olive's third Cantor in August of 2001. He also is Artistic Director of the National Lutheran Choir, and adjunct faculty member for the Master of Sacred Music program at Luther Seminary.

David Cherwien holds degrees in Organ Performance, Theory and Composition, and Choral Music Education. He has studied in Berlin and Aix-en-Provence, France.

Cantor Cherwien has served the church as a full-time musician for over 25 years. His specialty and passion is congregational song, encouraging meaningful and vibrant participation through his improvisations and creative approach. His ministry spreads across the country through his frequent hymn festivals, workshops, guest appearances, and over 100 publications.



Baroque violinist Marc Levine and harpsichordist Tami Morse are the founders of *Flying Forms*, the baroque chamber music ensemble, and in 2011 created The Baroque Room in downtown St. Paul. They have performed recently at Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, Yale University, and the Boston Early Music Festival; they have been hailed by harpsichordist Arthur Haas as "the bright future of early music" for their creative programming and virtuosic playing.

Venezuelan-born cellist Tulio Rondón started professional life early, appointed principal cellist of the Aragua Symphony Orchestra at age 15, and, at age 17, adjunct professor at the Simón Bolivar Conservatory. He holds a doctorate from University of Arizona, and studied with Jaap ter Linden in Amsterdam. Locally, he has performed with Pro Arte Quartet, Lyra Baroque, Bach Society of Minnesota, and frequently with Mr. Levine and Ms. Morse. He is currently professor of cello at University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire.





Arthur Halbardier is a retired pastor who served ELCA congregations in Missouri and Illinois. Prior to ordination, he was an organist and choral director for churches in New York City and Chicago.

He did graduate study at the School of Sacred Music at Union Theological Seminary, and received his Master of Music degree from Northwestern University.

At Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago his interests in music and theology

came together in his Master of Divinity thesis, *Johann Sebastian Bach as Theologian*. In retirement, he has continued studying Bach and his music, as well as playing the harpsichord. He and his wife, Elaine, are members of Mount Olive and sing in the Mount Olive Cantorei.
