THE EIGHTH ANNUAL BACH TAGE AT MOUNT OLIVE

"Bach Tage is such a joy, and so nourishing to me as a church musician and as a human being."

"We enjoyed everything about Bach Tage - except that the weekend is over so quickly!"

In 1714, young Bach, the busy organist, orchestral composer, conductor, sought-after organ consultant and recitalist added composing and performing church cantatas to his duties.

Erschallet, ihr lieder was a favorite cantata of Bach. It stands among those few works from his youth which he continued to perform into his later years without major changes.

The Venetian masters such as Vivaldi influenced both Bach and Georg Philipp Telemann. Bach and Telemann were contemporaries whose careers took much different directions, yet they remained life-long friends and colleagues.

These connections, developments, influences, and music of these two great masters will be the topic of this Eighth Annual *Bach Tage* at Mount Olive.



Kathy Saltzman Romey, conductor, is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Minnesota, and Artistic Director of The Minnesota Chorale, which performs frequently with The Minnesota Orchestra.

Kathy Romey studied in Germany at the *Frankfurt Musikhochschule* under acclaimed conductor Helmuth Rilling, receiving an artistic degree in choral conducting.

She has been associated with the Oregon Bach Festival since 1984, and is principal chorus master of the 54-voice professional choir. Additionally, she has been a chorus master to the *Internationale Bachakademie Stuttgart*.

Kathy Romey was named 2002 Conductor of the Year by the Minnesota Chapter, American Choral Directors Association.



David Cherwien is Cantor of Mount Olive Lutheran Church, Artistic Director of the National Lutheran Choir, and a frequent clinician and leader of hymn festivals across the country.

Dr. Cherwien holds degrees in Organ Performance, Theory and Composition, and Choral Music Education. He has studied in Berlin and Aix-en-Provence, France.

Cantor Cherwien has served the church as a full-time musician for over 25 years. His specialty and passion is congregational song, encouraging meaningful and vibrant participation through his brilliant improvisations and creative approach. He is composer of more than 100 published works, including collections of music for organ, and arrangements and original compositions for choir.



Arthur Halbardier, presenter, is a retired pastor who served ELCA congregations in Missouri and Illinois. Prior to ordination, he was an organist and choral director for churches in New York and Chicago.

He did graduate study at the School of Sacred Music at Union Theological Seminary, and received the Master

of Music degree from Northwestern University. He began to explore the theological content in Bach's music while at Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago, resulting in his Master of Divinity thesis, *Johann Sebastian Bach as Theologian*. Bach studies, presentations on Bach to various groups, as well as playing the harpsichord keep him busy in retirement.
