The St Johns Cantata Program is an ongoing program presenting the cantatas and choral music of J.S. Bach in the context for which it was written, liturgical Lutheran church services. The services include organ music on St John's splendid 1992 Smenge pipe organ and congregational singing of chorales and liturgy. Over 100 different Bach cantatas have been presented in over 140 events, which have included the B Minor and Lutheran masses, Magnificat, motets and Latin liturgical music. The St Johns Bach Orchestra plays on original instruments. The church's original instrument collection includes a Smenge chamber organ, and sets of oboes da caccia, baroque timpani and cornetti. The program is directed by Dr Graham Lieschke.

The program has developed substantial local and international collaborations. Dr Lieschke was awarded the 2004 Dame Roma Mitchell Churchill Fellowship to cultivate links with similar programs overseas. St Johns Visiting Music Directors have been Thomas Schmidt (2004, St Peter's Lutheran Church, New York, USA), Georg Christoph Biller (2006, Thomaskirche, Leipzig, Germany), Albrecht Koch (2010, Dom St Marien, Freiberg, Germany) and Rick Erickson (2013, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, New York, USA).

The program is an activity of the St Johns Southgate congregation. The St Johns Southgate Bach Foundation Inc was formed in June 2011 to encourage donations and other activities supporting the program.
