

From Pastor Kathryn

I'm currently reading a book for my Doctor of Ministry studies about technology and the church. While looking for insight into how social media can be utilized for the betterment of the church community, I came across a statement from it that caused me to pause and laugh. Published in 2004, the book on "new technologies" said the following about cell phones, making the book's author seem like a modernday Nostradamus: "There is a possibility that the cell phone could be combined with a wireless PDA (personal data assistant) that would have the statement totally inaccurate, I potential to download sermon notes and scripture

and that "parents could set their cell phones to vibrate instead of ring and the nursery could reach them during worship." The author concluded this footnote by writing, "trust me - someone will do all these thinas somewhere someday." My, oh my, John Jewell didn't understand how prophetic he was! The primary point he was making about cell phones in the first place was that, in his opinion, how "cell phones should be checked at the door", since they can be proven to be intrusive. While I don't necessarily find that have to think about how dependent we are on cell





Volunteers have been meeting on Saturday mornings during the growing season since 2009 tilling, planting, harvesting, laughing, and getting to know each other better. We invite all ages to help out.






