Johann Sebastian Bach Six sonatas for violin and harpsichord, BWV 1014-1019

Bach's six sonatas for violin and harpsichord represent the culmination of the genre of the baroque trio sonata. Fifty years after they were composed, Bach's son, Carl Philipp Emanuel, praised these works as "unsurpassable." These performances, using instruments Bach himself would have recognised, reaffirm C.P.E. Bach's assessment for the 21st-century listener.
